Anna Stains was born between 1785 and 1794 probably in Springfield Township, Huntingdon, Pennsylvania¹ and died during the winter of 1857-58 in Iowa.² She married **Joshua Greenland**³ sometime between late 1810 and 1812.⁴ He was born 19 Jun 1786⁵ in Baltimore County, Maryland, probably at Hickory Ridge Resurveyed,⁶ died 30 March 1841 in Trough Creek Valley, Huntingdon, Pennsylvania⁷ and was buried in Trough Creek Valley Baptist Cemetery.⁸ This couple had several known children:

- Nancy³ Greenland, she married Hugh Madden⁹ before 1837 in Huntingdon County.¹⁰
- Mary G. Greenland, married Reuben Madden, ¹¹ a brother of Hugh who married Mary's older sister, Nancy (see above). ¹²
- Hiram Greenland, married Sarah Campbell on 9 Oct 1845 in Huntingdon County.
- Simeon Greenland, married Edith "Edie" C. Everett.¹⁴
- Aaron Greenland, married Mary Jane Webb on 9 Jan 1850 in Jefferson County, Iowa.
- Charity Greenland, married Dutton Cutshall before 1844, probably in Huntingdon County, Penn.¹⁶
- Daniel Greenland, married Mary Jane Bradshaw on 15 Apr 1849 in Cedar Township.¹⁷
- Robert Greenland, married Allie Jane Stradling on 7 Jan 1858 in Warren County, Iowa.

Anna is generally thought to have been a daughter of **Daniel Stains** and **Charity (--?--)** although no known records specifically state this. However, a reasonable hypothesis for her parentage can be deduced based upon the following statement located in an 1829 land deed:

"...Joshua Greenland and Ann Greenland his wife...[for] the sum of one hundred dollars...quit claim unto David Stains of Springfield township...one ninth part of all the real estate...situated...in Springfield township...late the estate of Daniel Stains..."

This strongly suggests her father was Daniel Stains and that she may have had a brother, David. This is further supported by the following:

- Between 1817 and 1825 in Springfield Township, Huntingdon County, Daniel Stains is assessed and taxed with 552 acres of land (330 are his and he is leasing out a separate 222 acres).²⁰
- April 1823, Charity Stains and David Stains are appointed as administrators of Daniel Stains, deceased, suggesting a family relationship.²¹
- In 1827 and 1828 Springfield Township, Charity Stains is taxed with 552 acres, ²² the same amount of land belonging to Daniel.
- In 1829 1831, David Stains is assessed and taxed with 552 acres of land (330 + 222), ²³ an amount identical to Daniel and Charity.
- In 1836, "Elender" Stains conveys her one ninth part of Daniel Stains estate to David Stains, it being situated in Springfield township.²⁴
- In 1864, Daniel Stains conveys to Oliver and Robert A. Madden land he inherited from Daniel Stains, deceased. It mentions additional heirs of Daniel Stains: Mary, wife of George Robertson, Sarah, wife of Dutton Lane with her one ninth part, Thompson Stains, David Stains, and *reference* to the additional [unnamed] heirs who previously conveyed their parts to David Stains.²⁵

Anna (Stains) Greenland previously conveyed her one ninth part of Daniel Stains estate to David Stains, a named heir of Daniel Stains. Elender Stains and Sarah (Stains) Lane also conveyed their inherited one ninth parts of Daniel Stains estate to either David or Daniel Stains [Jr.]. Charity and David Stains, as appointed administrators of the estate of Daniel Stains paid taxes on Daniel's 552 acres until well after Daniel's death. Anna (Stains) Greenland was a daughter of Daniel Stains and possibly Charity (--?--).
